WINEMAKING NOTES

Planted in 1992, Alderpoint is another vineyard that features the Martini clone of Pinot Noir and has become a key vineyard source for Joseph Jewell Wines, beginning with the 2013 vintage. With shale-like soils and positioned 500 feet above the middle fork of the Eel River, this vineyard also has extremely low yields, often registering at less than 2 tons per acre. The cooling influence of the river and the stony soils are essential in the development of flavors and textures that have become the signature of the wines from Alderpoint.

TASTING NOTES

A complex bouquet beginning with a distinct impression of savory herbs, coupled with a subtle touch of salinity. Pomegranate adds a layer of fruity intrigue, while understated hints of vanilla and soy provide intriguing depth.
